Parsha Stats for אצוה

ואתה תצוה את בני ישראל ...

הצוה has 101 Psukim in it. The גר"א points out that the Yahrtzeit of ברשת משה always falls out (on לי אדר) during the week of פרשת תצוה. s name, however, is not ever mentioned in ברשת תצוה (the only time this occurs since his birth in שמות (פר) שמות of "מחני נא מספרך" of קיום.

However, even though משה's presence seems to be lacking, משה is present in a hidden fashion. The name משה spelled out is "אין הא" The hidden letters of his name (the one's not used to spell משה) are אי, ו, א ברשת הצוה – which add up to 101 - the exact number of Psukim in פרשת הצוה.

So even when משה is not here to the naked eye, he is ever-present. So too, physically passed away on לשה but through the תורה he is still with us. He is 'here' in the number of 101 (Psukim in the Parsha) and we also know the significance of the number 101 as Chazal tell us that "One who learns something 100 times is not like the one who learns it 101 times."

Rav Zalman Sorotzkin sees another important message in משה's omission from this Parsha. Even though משה was the greatest leader that בלל ישראל ever had, he was not the focus of Bnei Yisrael's מבורת ה' Even at the time of his birth and death when the חורה mentions משה, בגרים and their משה, בגרים is not mentioned. יהק"בה is our focus on קבורת ה' without a middleman; as opposed to the "religions" of other nations that are fixated on the birth and death of their so-called "deity".

We either learn it from a Pasuk in דניאל that says "יהב חבמתא לחבימין" or we learn it from the Pasuk of "הבמתא לחבם לב נתתי חבמה" which is found in בי תשא.


So how does a person first have הכמה in order to acquire הכמה from הקיבה? Says Reb Chaim Volozhiner, the Pasuk says יראת הי הכמה המים. The prerequisite for יראת הי and יראת הי is something that one must first acquire on his own - יראת שמים חוץ מיראת שמים. This is what the Gemarah means - Hashem gives הכמה to one that has יראת הי required for הכמה.

The Pasuk says "והקמיר עליו אהרן קמרת סמים בבקר בבקר בהימיבו את הגרת מחד אהרן קמרת מים בבקר בבקר מנורה "And אהרן should bring the קמרת when he's cleaning the lamps of the מנורה each morning."

Reb Moshe Feinstein זצ״ל asks what does the הקשרת קשרת have to do with the המבת הגרות?

Says Reb Moshe, there are things that in the strict letter of the law are not אטור, and someone could even (unscrupulously) argue that they are מצוות. However, the מלמיד הכם has a הוש הריה, a sense of smell, as to whether it is proper or not. The מנורה represents הורה and the קטרת prepresents the sense of smell. Sometimes we may not even understand the protestations of Gedolim to certain things. However, these Gedolim have a חוש הריה that must be trusted when they say what is proper and what is not.

A story is told about the און איש. His visit to a medical specialist was prefaced by the doctor being told that the איש was a "Great Rabbi". The doctor asked the און איש "What is the difference between a Rabbi and a Great Rabbi?"

Answered the אוון איש, "The same difference that there is between a doctor and a *great* doctor - A doctor says whatever his book says, but when it comes to a great doctor, what he says is already in the book! So too by a "Great Rabbi", what he says is in the book!"

ANSWER TO LAST WEEK'S CHALLENGE QUESTION

The question that was asked was, how is it possible for a person to be מחוייב a punishment of Malkos for bringing the Korban Pesach?

The situation to consider was as follows:

- 1) the Korban Pesach was Shechted at the correct time
- 2) the Korban Pesach was Shechted in the proper place
- 3) the Korban Pesach was Shechted in the correct manner.

One answer is, if a person who did not yet have a Bris Milah brought the Korban Pesach anyway, he would be מחוייב a punishment of Malkos. A second answer is, if one brought the Korbon Pesach while he still had Chametz in his possession, he too would get Malkos.

A lesson in ביבוד אב ואם

There is a famous story brought down in Mesechtes Kiddushin. The stone of Shevet Binyamin from the אושן was needed in the Bais Hamikdash. A goy by the name of Dama Ben Nissina had the exact stone that was needed. When the Chachomim approached Dama Ben Nissina to buy it from him, he realized his father was guarding the stone by sleeping on top of the key to where it was stored. Although they offered him a tremendous amount of money for the stone, he insisted on not waking up his father up out of respect. As a reward for his great level of בובוד אב ואם, Hashem rewarded him with by causing a שרו אדומה to be born on his farm the next year, which he was then able to sell at a great profit to the Chachomim.

The משך חכמה explains the reason why this lesson was brought out through the stone of Shevet Binyamin. The story of מחירת יוסף caused Yaakov Avinu a lot of צער. Even Yosef himself unwittingly also caused Yaakov צער by not informing him of his whereabouts for all those years. Binyamin was the only son who was not involved in the מחירת יוסף, and was therefore the only son whose ביבוד אב was untarnished. For this reason, he was זוכה brought out through him.

The Chidushei Harim points out another aspect of this story. Why was Dama Ben Nissina rewarded with a פרה אדומה? The Mitzvah of ביבוד אב ואם is a very understandable and logical mitzvah which makes a lot of sense to us. Hashem was sending us a message that the Mitzvah of אדומה which is a חוק (and all the other Mitzvos that are חוקים that we don't fully understand are just as important as the Mitzvah of מיבור אב ואם (and other such Mitzvos), for which we do understand the reasoning and the logic behind them.

- 239. If one has not yet Davened Krias Sh'ma by Shachris and the Tzibbur is starting Sh'moneh Esrei, one should not skip Sh'ma to Daven Sh'moneh Esrei with the Tzibbur, {because being "Soimech Geulah L'Tefillah" is more important than Tefillah B'Tzibbur by Shachris}.
- 240. However, by Maariv, one should Daven Sh'moneh Esrei with the Tzibbur, and then say Krias Sh'ma with all the Brachos (that precede and follow Sh'ma), after davening Sh'moneh Esrei with the Tzibbur.
- 241. The first three Brachos of Sh'moneh Esrei are "Sh'vach" praise of Hashem, and therefore one may not request personal needs in those Brachos.
- 242. The Mishna Brurah cites the Tur who permits adding requests on behalf of the Tzibbur, however, the accepted Minhag is to refrain from any additions in the first three Brachos except for those added by Chazal (for example: additions during Aseres Y'mei T'shuva etc.)
- 243. The last three Brachos of Sh'moneh Esrei are thanks to Hashem, and one may not add any personal requests in these Brachos.
- 244. However, during the middle Brachos of Sh'moneh Esrei (after Attah Kadosh and before Retzay) one may add personal requests to the Brachos.
